The John Glenn School of Public Affairs High School Internship Program is a unique public service internship program that allows high school students in the winter quarter of their senior year to gain first-hand experience within organizations in the public service sector. Students also participate in an academic seminar at The Ohio State University as part of the Post Secondary Enrollment Option Program (PSEOP). The seminar class reinforces the internship experience while focusing on American democracy and the nature and reason for public service.



Application Requirements

- Graduating seniors from Delaware, Fairfield, Franklin, Licking, Madison, Pickaway, & Union counties
- Top 15percent of their class
- 3.5 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale
- SAT of 1150 or ACT of 26
- Outstanding civic participation
- Acceptance into the Ohio State Academy program, www-afa.adm.ohio-state.edu/undergrad/academy

Application Procedure

Interested students should download the application. Applications must be complete or they will not be considered. Students will be admitted into the program until the class is filled. There is no application fee for the Glenn High School Internship Program.

Applicants selected for participation will be sent letters shortly after their acceptance and will be required to attend a program informational meeting in the fall.

Students must meet with their High School counselors to determine if graduation requirements can still be met while participating in the program.
