The John Glenn School of Public Affairs provides an opportunity for Ohio State juniors and seniors to study and work in our nation's capital. The Washington Academic Internship Program selects outstanding undergraduates in any field of study to spend a quarter in Washington, D.C. John Glenn Fellows are placed in internships that reflect their particular areas of academic interest. They also complete a policy and public service class, attend weekly seminars, and write a policy paper.

### Earn 15 hours of upper division Ohio State course credit

- 5 credits for completing an internship
- 5 credits for writing a policy paper
- 5 credits for a policymaking and public service course

### Schedule Breakdown

- Internship — 32 hours a week
- Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday
- Policy seminars
- Weekly evening guest speakers
- Policy & Public Service Class, Friday 8:30-Noon
- Study tours to sites such as the Library of Congress, Embassy Row, Department of State, Supreme Court, CIA and World Bank on Friday afternoons

Students reside together in a Capitol Hill residence selected for its services, proximity to the Metro system, safety, and neighborhood conveniences. The program arranges for housing and applies the charges to each student's university account.
