Complete one finance courses:

- PUBLIC AFFAIRS 4310 State and Local Government Finance (*Prerequisite: ECON 2001*)
- ECONOMICS 4300 Government Finance in the American Economy (*Prerequisite: ECON 2001*)
- ECONOMICS 4320 Public Expenditures and Cost-Benefit Analysis (*Prerequisite: ECON 2001*)

Complete an additional Public Affairs course:

Course must be 4000-level or higher. For example:

- PUBLIC AFFAIRS 4000 Policy Evaluation
- PUBLIC AFFAIRS 4020 Contemporary Issues in Governance: Washington DC
- PUBLIC AFFAIRS 4510 Law and Public Affairs
- PUBLIC AFFAIRS 4010 Public Affairs Decision Making
- PUBLIC AFFAIRS 4191 Internship in P.A.

Take one Political Science course:

Complete any Political Science course at the 3000-level or higher.

Complete a capstone course:

- PUBLIC AFFAIRS 4011 Public Affairs Capstone (*Prerequisites: 2110, 2120, 2130, 3000, 3500*)
- PUBLIC AFFAIRS 4021 Research Paper in Public Affairs: Washington DC (*Prerequisites: 2110; must be accepted into Washington Academic Internship Program*)

General Education: ECON 2001 and Data Analysis are prerequisites for some core courses. Quantitative and Logical Skills, Data Analysis, and Natural Science GE requirements differ between BA and BS.

Specialization (15 hours): Students may fulfill the specialization requirements by completing an interdisciplinary Public Affairs specialization track, an approved minor, a personalized track, or a double major.
